APD's Special Operations Group

- ◇ Responsible for investigations and proactive enforcement
 - ◇ Illegal guns
 - ◇ Gangs
 - ◇ Narcotics
 - ◇ Prostitution
 - ◇ Human trafficking
 - ◇ Alcohol and tobacco business compliance
- ◇ APD's Federal Task Force partnerships and the region's ATF National Integrated Ballistic Information Network (NIBIN) system



SOG – Past Three Years

- ◇ Over **100** illegal guns seized
 - ◇ **Numerous** assault rifles, fully automatic firearms and Ghost guns
- ◇ **Thousands** of grams of illegal drugs
 - ◇ Cocaine
 - ◇ Cannabis
 - ◇ Methamphetamine
 - ◇ Heroin/ Fentanyl
- ◇ **Millions** of dollars in cash
 - ◇ Over **\$20k** in seized US currency
 - ◇ **Millions** seized by federal task forces
- ◇ **Hundreds** of hours conducting covert surveillance

Why?



- ❖ SOG Unit regularly conducts surveillance, executes search warrants and other high-risk operations that requires a dependable vehicle
- ❖ SOG currently uses a 2004 Chevy Van to accomplish these tasks
- ❖ 2004 Chevy van currently has numerous mechanical issues, no reliable HVAC and is being removed from the city fleet.
- ❖ New vehicle will provide SOG with a modernized surveillance/deployment vehicle with more seating, better HVAC, and a high-tech camera surveillance system.
