- All members of the city council shall constitute the 5

- 8 meetings at the times and in the locations designated by resolution
- 9 of the council. The committee of the whole may also meet during
- the hour immediately preceding any regular or special meeting of 10
- the city council. Special meetings of the committee of the whole 11
- may be called by the mayor or by any four (4) of its members in 12

The committee of the whole shall also consider such other matters within its 15 16 jurisdiction as may be referred to it by the mayor or by individual 17 aldermen. It may deliberate on any matter that the city council 18 has placed on its agenda.

- 13 committees set forth in this Section. Each standing committee shall

- council, each alderman shall serve on at least one (1) but not 16
- 17 more than three (3) standing committees.
- 18 The mayor shall appoint the members of the standing
- committees with the advice and consent of the city council. The 19
- mayor shall submit a complete set of committee appointments at the 20
