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OVERVIEW

SPRINGFIELD LEGISLATIVE LANDSCAPE

Now is a pivotal moment for the City of Aurora to elevate its presence. The election of Mayor John Laesch, marked a shift from Republican to Progressive Democratic leadership. This change gives Aurora a unique opportunity to communicate a bold message of change, collaboration, and transparent governance that reflects the city's new direction and priorities.

This momentum should be leveraged to showcase Aurora's vision for growth and partnership—positioning the city as a key player in shaping Illinois's future. Aurora is uniquely positioned to invigorate its relationships with key legislative champions through hosting legislative luncheons for the Mayor that bring together members of the City Council and the General Assembly to strengthen partnerships and advance shared priorities.

At the same time, Illinois is facing significant budget pressures due to the lack of federal matching funds across critical sectors. This has intensified competition for one-time capital allocations and caucus appropriations, as municipalities and organizations across the state seek limited resources to close fiscal gaps. In this highly competitive environment, the City of Aurora must strategically differentiate itself to ensure its priorities are recognized and advanced. Our team will position Aurora as a progressive leader among Illinois municipalities— championing sustainability initiatives such as renewable energy adoption, green infrastructure investments, and climate-resilient development; advancing progressive taxation policies that ensure fairness and equity while protecting working families; and fostering direct democracy and transparency in government through measures like participatory budgeting, and expanded public input in policymaking. By linking these forward-looking values with Aurora's status as the second-largest city in Illinois, we will demonstrate that the city is not only deserving of state investment but is also committed to modeling innovative policies that can benefit the entire state.

Anticipated Challenges and Mitigation

The state is facing significant budget pressure due to a lack of federal matching funds for various sectors. This has intensified competition for one-time capital and caucus appropriations as numerous organizations seek state assistance to close budget gaps. Given the City's status as the second largest city in population in Illinois, we must strategically differentiate its needs to secure funding.

Our mitigation strategy involves a two-pronged approach:

- **Securing "City Champions":** We will focus on cultivating and mending relationships with the Aurora delegation to secure smaller-scale project funding from their individual member funds. This is a more reliable and less competitive path to success in the current climate.
- **Targeted Caucus Advocacy:** Instead of a broad, unfocused approach, we'll work with key leaders and budgeteers to position the city as a critical asset, demonstrating its economic and social return on investment for the entire state. This requires consistent, data-driven messaging and building strong relationships with legislative leaders and caucuses.

Specific Action Plan Steps

The lobby team will help advance the needs and priorities of the City of Aurora by building and enhancing relationships with the Governor's office and area state legislators.

Operational funding

- Seek funding options for general revenues, including possible financial transaction tax, data center tax, or new funding from casinos.
- TheGoal would be to obtain additional revenues by the end of Springfield 2026 session on May 30.

Capital projects

- Seek capital construction funds from the General Assembly and the Governor.
- Develop proposals by January 2026.
- Meet with key staff, legislators, and administration to advance the capital proposal before the end of the Spring 2026 session.

State government maneuvering

- Help Aurora apply for grants at IDNR, DCEO, IDOT and other agencies.
- Help navigate key state agency issues on transportation and other regulations.

Land bank

- File and advance legislation – if necessary – to help City of Aurora develop a land bank.
- Land bank will reduce and return vacant land and abandoned buildings back into reliable and sustainable community assets.

River Edge Redevelopment Zone Act reauthorization

- The River Edge Redevelopment Zone Act Reauthorization expires in 2026 thus the lobby team will take a leading role in ensuring the reauthorization of the tax credit law.
- Aurora will show how the law has helped redevelop downtown Aurora.

Aurora Lobby Day in Springfield/Illinois Municipal League

- Organize lobby day for Mayor and Alderpeople
- Meet with Speaker, Senate President, and the Governor to present Aurora's key priorities.

Stakeholder Engagement

- We will strategically target the **Metro West Council of Governments** and the **Illinois Municipal League** to connect directly with local government interests and municipalities across the state. In addition, our outreach will encompass **other municipal lobbyists** to broaden our network within local government advocacy. Finally, we will engage both **Environmental advocacy groups** and **Progressive advocacy groups** to ensure we incorporate perspectives critical to policy areas of sustainability, equity, and social change.

Liaison to other governmental entities

- The team will work as liaisons with county government as needed
- Kane County, Dupage, Will and Kendall Counties– Help navigate key issues that arise
- Will aid with city departments with issues such as police and public works
- Federal government – Help organize and develop federal earmark funding requests and maneuver key federal issues that arise.

Media and social media advocacy

- Gain press attention around the introduction of legislation for the City of Aurora.
- Set up a rotating social media program that includes articles and posts focusing on the General Assembly's Spring session from January until May of 2026.

Communication

- Monthly reports to be distributed to members of the City Council.
- Presentations before the City Council when necessary.

Expectations of the City of Aurora

Building on the success of our collaboration with the Illinois School Counselors Association, our proactive approach not only transformed their presence in Springfield but also contributed to a near doubling of their membership. We turned the association into a key player in education policy. Following a successful educational session in Spring 2025, we are now preparing to advance their own legislative initiative. We have secured a sponsor, drafted the legislation, and are strategically planning for its movement during the Spring 2026 legislative session, cementing their role as influential leaders in Illinois.

Metropolitan Water Reclamation District

Fuentes Consulting represents the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District. As part of their government relations team, we have successfully orchestrated legislative efforts and lobbying events for the association, leading to the passage of more than ten key initiatives. We have been instrumental in securing lead sponsors in the House and Senate and aiding in building robust support for initiatives among legislators and stakeholders. Our role extends to managing and mitigating challenges as they arise, ensuring that all actions remain aligned with the board's strategic agenda.

Parity for Pumps

Fuentes Consulting was retained by Parity for Pumps (P4P), a national initiative launched in 2019 to eliminate sales and use taxes on breast pumps and breast supplies. Illinois was identified as a key state, but because P4P had no established presence in the state, it was our responsibility to introduce the organization to the legislative landscape, key players, and grassroots advocates. Through our efforts, Illinois became one of only a handful of states to enact a sales tax exemption on breast pumps and breast supplies, ensuring greater affordability and access for breastfeeding mothers.

Our work spanned throughout three years of persistence, commitment, and attention to detail. We built a broad coalition of advocates, engaged legislative leadership, and collaborated with the

Illinois Department of Revenue to assess fiscal impact and refine the scope of what qualified as exempt supplies. Fuentes Consulting also developed a compelling message, testified during committee meetings, and worked with members to create media buzz around the topic. Our work paid off, resulting in the unanimous passage of the bill in the House and Senate.

This victory reduced financial barriers for families, advanced maternal and child health, and positioned Illinois as a national leader on this issue. More importantly, it showcased Fuentes Consulting's proven ability to manage long-term, complex legislative campaigns that require coalition building, technical expertise, and bipartisan support.

Cost Proposal:

Fuentes Consulting will charge \$7,000 per month from October 1, 2025, until September 30, 2026. No expenses will be charged unless they are approved in advance by the Mayor's Office.

This fee provides the city of Aurora with a continuous, robust legislative presence in Springfield. The monthly retainer includes capital campaign build out including the creation of material to aid in pursuing funding, legislative tracking, strategic advice and coalition building.

Rules and regulations

The lobbyist team will follow all state lobbyist and sexual harassment regulations. Our company maintains our own sexual harassment policy.
