- (d) The committee of the whole shall receive the reports of 11 all other committees, deliberate on matters therein contained 12 13 prior to council consideration, recommend to the council whatever 14 action it deems appropriate regarding them, and, by unanimous consent, direct that an item be placed on the consent agenda for 15 consideration at the next council meeting. The committee of the 16 whole shall also consider such other matters within 17 jurisdiction as may be referred to it by the mayor or by individual 18 aldermen. It may deliberate on any matter that the city council 19 20 has placed on its agenda.

When considering revisions to the city code, the Rules, Administration, and Procedures Committee shall solicit the advice of standing committee or committees having responsibility over the code provisions undergoing revision.

- B. The Rules, Administration, and Procedures Committee

 shall have jurisdiction over all matters requiring

 city council approval initiated by the Mayor's

 Office, the Office of the Aldermen, the Law

 Department, and the City Clerk.
 - C. The Rules, Administration, and Procedures Committee shall appoint a Chief of Staff for the Office of the Aldermen and other administrative personnel therein and may from time-to-time adopt rules and policies governing the operations of said office.
 - D. The Rules, Administration, and Procedures Committee shall have jurisdiction over matters conferred upon it by Sec. 2-60(b) of this code.
 - E. In carrying out its duties under Subparagraphs C and D of this Paragraph 1, the Rules, Administration, and Procedures Committee shall have final action authority on behalf of the city council.
 - 2. The Building, Zoning, and Economic Development Committee.
 - A. The Building, Zoning, and Economic Development

 Committee shall have jurisdiction over all matters

 requiring city council approval involving the

 airport, annexation, boundary agreements, business

- development, building code development and enforcement economic development, historic preservation, permitting, planning, and zoning.
 - B. The Building, Zoning, and Economic Development
 Committee shall have all power and authority the
 city council previously conferred upon or vested in
 the former Planning and Development Committee. All
 references to the Planning and Development
 Committee in all ordinances and resolutions shall
 be construed and understood to be references to the
 Building, Zoning, and Economic Development
 Committee.
 - C. The Building, Zoning, and Economic Development Committee shall have jurisdiction over all matters requiring city council approval initiated by the Development Services Department, excluding Animal Control and Property Standards.

3. The Finance Committee.

A. The Finance Committee shall have jurisdiction over all matters requiring city council approval pertaining to collective bargaining, personnel and civil service matters, not otherwise under the jurisdiction of the Civil Service Commission, taxation, city indebtedness, fees and service

charges, risk management, <u>purchasing policies</u>, management of <u>the city's moniescity funds</u>, the library budget and tax levy, the city's operating, pension, _insurance, motor fuel tax and capital budget, <u>tax levies</u>, development agreements, tax increment and business improvement districts, other incentive agreements, real property acquisition, and special service areas except those required by the Kane County Stormwater Ordinance. Notwithstanding any provision of this section, the Finance Committee shall have exclusive jurisdiction over all departmental budgets.

B.A. Except for expenditures related to public works

projects specifically included in the city's annual

budget, the Finance Committee shall give its advice

on matters involving the expenditure of city funds

in amounts greater than twice the amount requiring

council authorization. and matters that required

budget amendments or transfers.

C.B. The Finance Committee shall have jurisdiction over all matters requiring city council approval initiated by the Finance Department or the Human Resources Department.

4. The Public Health, Safety, and Transportation Committee.

- A. The Public Health, Safety, and Transportation 1 2 Committee shall have jurisdiction over all matters 3 requiring city council approval involving public safety, including police, fire and emergency 4 management, the number and classifications of 5 6 liquor or tobacco licenses, housing, rental 7 licensing, public transportation, including 8 commuter rail and busing, neighborhood 9 redevelopment, youth and senior services, customer service, waste management contracts, animal 10 control, property standards, neighborhood 11 12 redevelopment, and human and community services.
 - B. The Public Health, Safety, and Transportation
 Committee shall have jurisdiction over all matters
 requiring city council approval initiated by the
 Innovation and Core Services Department, excluding
 the Information Technology Division, the Police
 Department, the Fire Department, the Divisions of
 Animal Control and Property Standards.
 - 5. The Infrastructure and Technology Committee.
 - A. The Infrastructure and Technology Committee shall have jurisdiction over all matters requiring city council approval pertaining to the city's technological infrastructure, its fiber optic

- network, communication and data transfer, public parks and open spaces, public roadways, traffic, and parking, public works, including street, sanitation, public utilities and public buildings and grounds, rights-of-way, the environment, flooding, water treatment and distribution and storm and sanitary sewers, and special service areas related thereto.
- B. The Infrastructure and Technology Committee shall have jurisdiction over all matters requiring City Council approval initiated by the Public Works Department and the Division of Information Technology.
- C. The Infrastructure and Technology Committee shall have all power and authority the city council previously conferred upon or vested in the former Buildings, Grounds, and Infrastructure Committee.

 All references to the Buildings, Grounds, and Infrastructure Committee in all city ordinances and resolutions shall be construed and understood to be references to the Infrastructure and Technology Committee.
- 23 Sec. 2-124. Special committees.

- 1 The council from time-to-time may establish special
- 2 committees by resolution. The resolution shall establish the
- 3 number of members of the special committee and their manner of
- 4 selection, the jurisdiction of the special committee, and the
- 5 duration of the special committee, which shall not extend beyond
- 6 the qualification of aldermen following the next consolidated
