TERM OF APPRENTICESHIP: The term of apprenticeship shall be Time-based, which has been established to be 4 years of not less than 6240 hours. Hours of labor shall be the same as established for other skilled employees in the occupation.

PROBATIONARY PERIOD: The probationary period shall be the first 1560 hours of the apprenticeship. During the probationary period, this contract may be cancelled by the apprentice or the sponsor upon written notice to the Department.

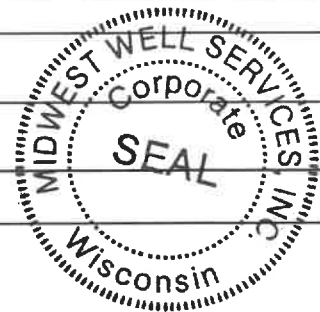

1. Agreement Documents.

In 1992 Milaeger Well & Pump joined forces with the Municipal Well & Pump to provide additional expertise going back to 1916. The company was purchased by Midwest Well Services, Inc. in September 2000, but continues to operate under the Municipal Well & Pump name. In 2005, the company purchased Pumpstation Professionals which expanded our services in the golf course and pump station controls market. In 2016, we purchased Peerless Well & Pump in Dubuque, IA expanding our geographic territory further into Iowa, Illinois, and southwestern Wisconsin.
