19	prescribed in the zoning ordinance.

22	The planning commission shall be comprised of:

26	(2) The planning commission members shall at all times include
27	one (1) representative from each of the following <mark>six seven</mark>
28	(6 7) taxing entities: School District 129, School District
29	131, School District 204, <u>School District 308,</u> Fox Metro
30	Sanitary District, Fox Valley Park District and Aurora
31	Township. The other seven <u>six</u> (67) members of the planning
32	commission shall be citizens at large, and shall have no

1	special interest in any of the <mark>six-seven (67</mark>) taxing entities
2	listed in this section.
3	(3) All members of the planning commission shall reside within
4	the <u>cityCity of Aurora</u> .

18	The thirteen (13) members of the planning commission shall be

22	their appointment and each and every year thereafter.

5	The planning commission shall have all of those powers <u>vested</u>

9	code.set forth in article 11, division 12 of The of the Illinois

27	executive secretary shall make a permanent record of all the acts
28	and doings of the planning commission and keep the same in his/her

2	The planning commission shall:
3	(1) Hear and report findings and recommendations to the mayor
4	and city council on all applications for amendments and
5	special use permits in the manner prescribed by standards
6	and other regulations set forth in the Aurora Zoning
7	Ordinance zoning ordinance.
8	(2) Initiate, direct and review, from time to time, studies of
9	the provisions of the Aurora Zoning Ordinance zoning
10	ordinance, and to make reports of its recommendations to the
11	mayor and city council.
12	(3) Hear and decide all matters upon which it is required to
13	pass under the Aurora Zoning Ordinance.
14	(4) Hear and pass upon applications for variations from the

A simple majority vote of the 27 planning commission may declare the position vacant and request 28 29 that the mayor appoint a new member to fill the term.
