Background

The property is located in Unincorporated Kane County. There are 5 bedrooms/2 bathrooms/8 beds for adult males with substance use disorders. The property has operated as a Group Home since December 2001. The Group Home maintains extremely high standards and is licensed by the Illinois Department of Human Services, Division of Substance Use Prevention & Recovery (SUPR). Consistently, SUPR contract compliance inspections report a score of 98%-100% compliance with the states' "Recovery Home" standards, and the same 100% score for the annual Montgomery Fire Department Inspections.

Structure of the Group Home (Summarization)

Group Home residents must abide by all state, local, and federal laws, must secure/maintain legitimate gainful employment, complete house chores, maintain stringent sanitation standards within the house, attend a minimum of 5 support groups/weekly, remain 100% abstinent from all un-prescribed moodaltering substances (as evidenced by: random drug/alcohol testing), adhere to strict curfew policies (e.g. 10pm, 11pm, or 12 midnight) depending upon the Phase they have advanced to, adhere to any and all probationary or judicial directives (if applicable), and follow a "Build your life around your recovery" treatment approach. Residents are not allowed to have overnight guests. When weather permits, residents gathering on the property to BBQ, picnic, fellowship, etc. must be dressed appropriately (shirts, shorts...), music and/or conversations to a community-friendly level, and in the back of the house. Loitering in front of the Group Home is against HFT policy. HFT requires residents to make a (minimal) 6-month commitment to living in the Group Home, but there are no limitations on length of stay. At the time of this writing, we have residents that have resided in the group home for 807 days, 544 days, 341 days, 278 days, 119 days and 117 days (avg. = 367.66) and still going. What this means is these gentlemen are living a substance-free, responsible, accountable, productive, and self-sufficient life in the community. On average, 85-90 percent of all Hope for Tomorrow residents report achieving "the longest and/or best quality sobriety they have ever experienced in their lifetime".

Community Perception of the Group Homes

To describe how well received the Group Home is in the neighborhood, I site the findings of my Master's Degree Thesis, titled, "NEIGHBORHOOD PERCEPTION OF PEER-LED RECOVERY HOMES", which I defended on August 26, 2008. With the help of my Thesis Director, we prepared a questionnaire and held a neighborhood meeting. The results of the meeting disclosed that very few residents in the neighborhood were aware that the three Group Homes existed, the ones that did know did not have anything negative to say about the Group Homes. We interpreted the results as follows, "If the residents of the three Recovery

Homes had displayed problematic behaviors, especially in a neighborhood with an active community watch program, it is probable that the community, as a whole, would be aware of these negative behaviors".

In addition, Hope for Tomorrow, Inc. operates two properties located at 469-479 N. Lake Street, Aurora, Illinois 60506. In 2010, after purchasing the properties, we applied for appropriate zoning operate as a Group Home and Substance Abuse Treatment Services and Support Services. Janet Swanson, the President of the Neighborhood Watch Program, and JJ, the Block Captain (who, at the time, resided across the street from 537 Hartford) went to the City Council's zoning meeting to speak on behalf of Hope for Tomorrow. Both Janet Swanson and JJ said, "Hope for Tomorrow and their Group Homes are not a problem in our community; they are the solution to the problems in our community".

Finally, over the years, as I have spoken with Kane County Sheriff Deputies patrolling the neighborhood by the Group Homes, I have repeatedly heard from many Kane County Deputies, "I did not know these homes were Group Homes". Again, if the homes were not properly managed, I am certain both the neighborhood and the Deputies would be aware they existed.

Qualifying Group Home Residents

At this time, Hope for Tomorrow only serves adult (18+ years of age) men in the Group Homes. In accordance with the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual (DSM-V), published by the American Psychological Association (2013), Group Home applicants must have a diagnosed substance use disability and may also be diagnosed with a co-occurring disability (e.g. generalized anxiety d/o (pp. 222-226), bi-polar d/o (pp. 123-139), major depressive d/o (pp.160-168)). Group Home residents must attend a face-to-face assessment and orientation with HFT Clinical Staff - when applying for Group Home residency. Within 72 hours of admission, all residents must complete and pass a 62 question House Rules Test with a passing score of 90% (56/62 correct). Residents that score below 90% must retake the test until they pass.

<u>Under no circumstances will Hope for Tomorrow accept an applicant with violent criminal background or an applicant with a crime against a child or children</u>. We have a ZERO TOLERANCE POLICY on these types of criminal behaviors.

Professional Staff/Clinicians

The Group Homes are professionally managed by a Masters Level Counselor with several State of Illinois Board Certifications (Jeffrey S. Gilbert, M.A.,C.A.D.C., P.C.G.C., C.O.D.P.), his assistant (Timothy Simms, A.A, C.A.D.C. C.O.D.P.), who also holds State of Illinois Certifications and is currently working to earn his Bachelors of Social Work (BSW) at Aurora University. Each Group Home has a live-in "Peer Leader" who is a senior resident of the home and helps to oversee the day-to-day activities. Clinical staff is on-call 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.

In Closing

Hope for Tomorrow, Inc. is a 501 (c) 3 not-for-profit social services agency and is located in Aurora, Illinois. Hope for Tomorrow is the only agency of its kind serving the citizens of Kane and Kendall County. The services that Hope for Tomorrow provides are crucial to the safety and well-being of Kane and Kendall County communities. Hope for Tomorrow's philosophy focuses on giving people a "hand-up" out
