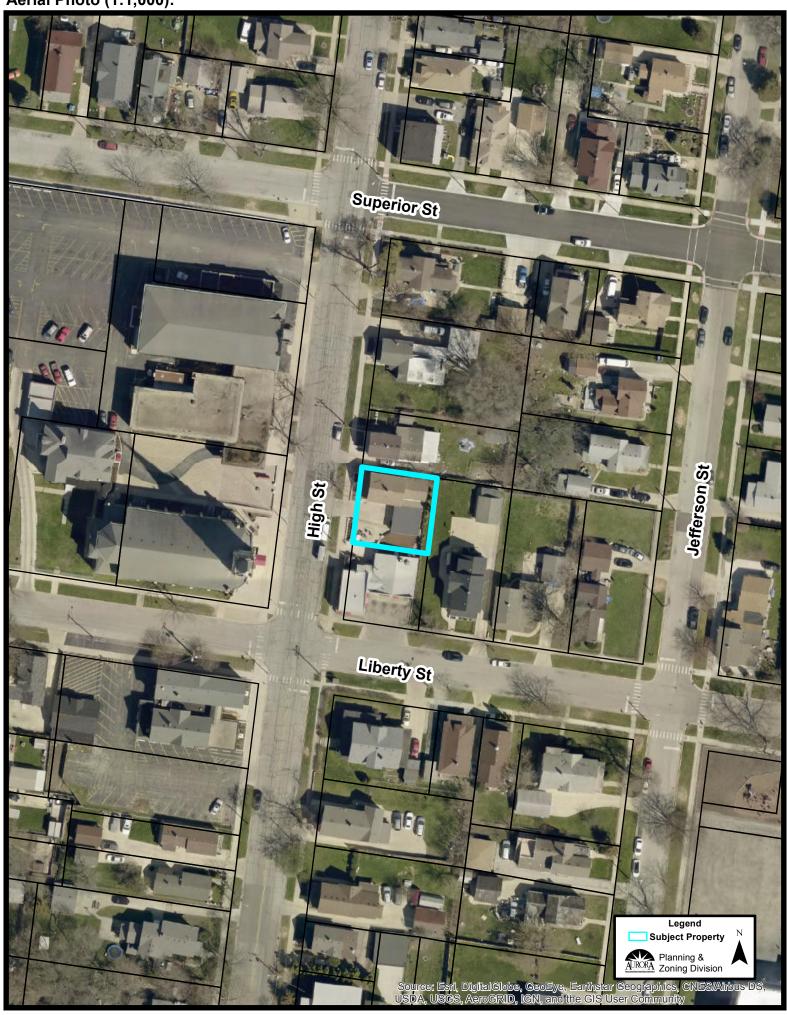

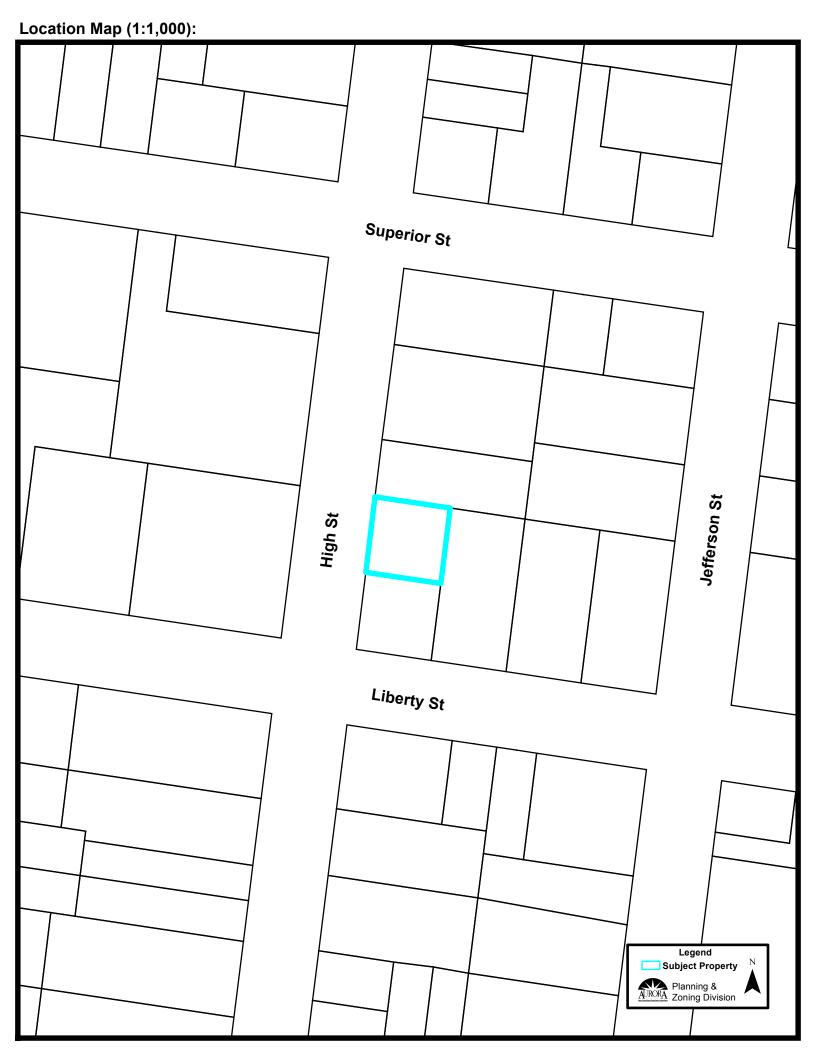

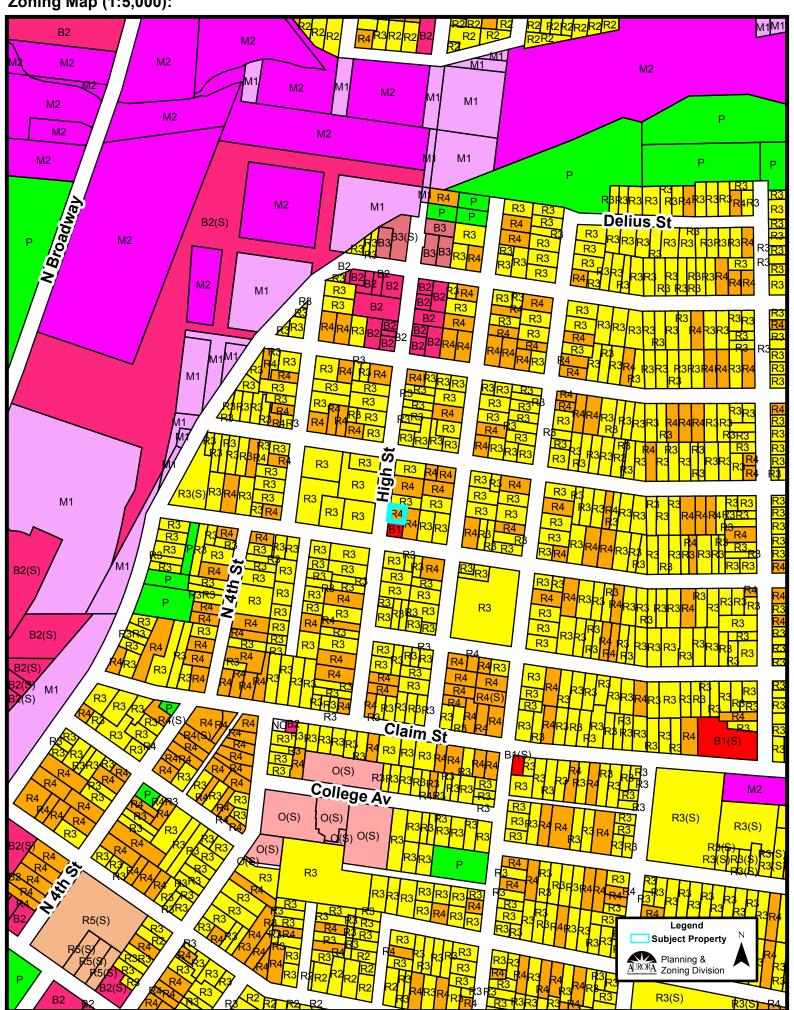
Aerial Overview Location Map Zoning Map Comprehensive Plan Map
