

Maintenance for Security Cameras Final Briefing Packet Aurora, IL

### **Project Overview**

### <u>BUSINESS</u> CHALLENGE

Aurora has over 560 existing or planned security/CCTV cameras spread across 15+ City owned or managed locations. Maintenance is all performed as needed and Maintenance service tiers range from 4 hours to 5 business days depending on criticality of the camera.

#### PROJECT BACKGROUND

The City of Aurora seeks a partner to provide maintenance and support (both reactive and preventative) to the City's security/CCTV cameras in a cost effective and responsive manner. That partner should be able to service all current and planned locations and the partnership should be flexible enough to evolve as cameras are added or removed.

The goal for this city-wide initiative is to ensure effectiveness and uptime for the camera program but also have greater ability to plan and manage costs.
