

1 Chapter 30 - PARKS AND RECREATION

2 ARTICLE I. - IN GENERAL

3 Sec. 30-1. - Parks continued property of city.

4 All the public parks and squares belonging to the city or under  
5 its control and management are continued as the property of the  
6 city and under its control and management for public park purposes  
7 and the health, recreation and enjoyment of its citizens and the  
8 public. The city shall maintain a listing of public parks under  
9 its control and shall regularly update said list from time-to-time  
10 by resolution.

12 Sec. 30-2. - Playground and recreation functions relinquished to  
13 park district.

14 The city relinquishes and turns over to The Fox River Valley  
15 Park District (Southern Kane County Sector) the function of  
16 planning, establishing and maintaining the municipal recreation  
17 program within the boundaries of the city, and relinquishes any  
18 and all powers which the city may have to levy and collect a tax  
19 known as the playground and recreation tax.

21 Sec. 30-3. - Management and enforcement of rules at ~~of~~ parks.

22 The superintendent of parks and his designees ~~are hereby deemed~~  
23 ~~peace officers and~~ are authorized to prepare and serve citations  
24 personally or by certified mail for violations of section 30-19.

2 Sec. 30 - 4. - Definitions.

3 City park means an area of land, owned and maintained by  
4 the city, for the enjoyment of the public, having facilities for  
5 rest and recreation.

6 Dawn means sunrise.

7 Dusk means one hour past sunset.

8 Dog park means an enclosed area for domesticated dogs to  
9 play, frolic, and socialize with other domesticated dogs  
10 typically without a leash.

11 Hours of Operation means the time periods during which a  
12 particular area or park is open to the public.

13 League Competition means a group of teams that play the  
14 same sport or activity against each other.

15 Permit means a license or other written document issued or  
16 granted by the Parks Maintenance subdivision, in accordance to  
17 policy, for a particular purpose or function. Said license or  
18 other written document is subject to the terms and conditions  
19 specified in writing so issued, as well as applicable federal,  
20 state, and local laws, ordinances, rules or regulations.

21 PGA Golf Operations Manager means the individual who  
22 operates the golf course at Phillips Park.

23 Superintendent of Parks means the individual who is the  
24 head of the Park Maintenance subdivision of the City of Aurora.

2 ARTICLE II. - PARK REGULATIONS

3 Sec. 30-15. - Dog park.

4 The city, by resolution, may designate certain city parks or  
5 portions of city parks as dog parks. Dog parks are for  
6 domesticated dogs only. It shall be the responsibility of the  
7 person who has control of the dog to promptly remove the  
8 animal's excrement. Enforcement of the rules at the dog park are  
9 enforced by Animal Control.

10 Sec. 30-16. - Use limited to park purposes.

11 It shall be unlawful for any person to do anything or act that  
12 would cause a park or park premises to be used or maintained for  
13 any other purpose than park purposes or that would interfere with  
14 or obstruct in any manner the use for such purposes.

16 Sec. 30-17. - Use of pavilions.

17 Requests for use of park pavilions in city parks ~~shall be~~  
18 ~~submitted to the government operations committee of the city~~  
19 ~~council for its consideration and final determination.~~ shall be  
20 submitted to the superintendent of parks.

21 (Code 1969, § 30-17)

22 Sec. 30-18. - Hours of Operation~~Open hours~~.

23 It shall be unlawful for any unauthorized person to be in or on  
24 any city park, park facility or park premises when it is closed.

1 All city parks, park facilities and park premises shall be closed  
2 to the public from dusk ~~one (1) hour after sunset~~ until ~~one (1)~~  
3 ~~hour before~~ sunrise daily, with the following exceptions:

4 (1) Baseball diamonds or tennis courts where there are league  
5 competition sporting events taking place more than one (1)  
6 hour after sunset or where the official facility lights for  
7 night play are still lit at such time; in such instances,  
8 the park facility and premises shall be deemed closed thirty  
9 (30) minutes after the sporting event ends or after the  
10 official facility lights are darkened, whichever is later.

11 (2) At the city golf courses during the months of April through  
12 September shall be open prior to one (1) hour before sunrise  
13 in the morning to anyone actually engaging in or immediately  
14 preparing to engage in the game of golf on the city golf  
15 course, if there is sufficient natural light for playing the  
16 game of golf, but in no event earlier than one (1) extra  
17 hour. This section shall not be construed to require any  
18 city golf course pro shop or clubhouse to be open at any  
19 particular time.

20 (3) Any persons attending or working at events, public or  
21 private, held at the city ~~either~~ golf course clubhouse  
22 facility, including but not limited to dinners, parties,  
23 wedding receptions, dances and other similar events.

1 (4) Snow sledding and ice skating permitted during hours which  
2 shall be set as provided under subsection (~~65~~) hereof for  
3 exceptions.

4 (5) ~~McCarty Park, which shall open daily at 6:00 a.m. Such~~  
5 other exceptions as posted on signs located at city parks.

6 (6) Any section or part of any park may be declared  
7 closed to the public by the city, at any time and for any  
8 interval of time, either temporarily or at regular intervals  
9 and stated intervals (daily or otherwise) and either entirely  
10 or for certain uses as the superintendent of parks finds  
11 necessary.

12 ~~(6) Such other exceptions as shall be provided for by~~  
13 ~~determination of the government operations committee of the~~  
14 ~~city council, or due to time constraints, by the director of~~  
15 ~~parks and recreation, and to be conspicuously posted~~  
16 ~~thereby.~~

17 (7) No person shall remain on city park property at a time  
18 when it is not open to the public, except when otherwise  
19 expressly authorized. Any person who violates this section  
20 may be charged with Trespass.

23 Sec. 30-19. - Parking.

1 It shall be unlawful for any person to drive or have parked a  
2 motor vehicle in a city park or on park premises, including any  
3 portion of any street, roadway or parking lot within or through  
4 park premises, from dusk to ~~one (1) hour after sunset to one (1)~~  
5 ~~hour before~~ sunrise daily with the exception of any person lawfully  
6 within the park or any person lawfully driving as through traffic.

7 The superintendent of parks ~~director of parks and recreation~~  
8 and his designees are authorized to enforce all provisions of  
9 Article V of Chapter 27 of this Code for violations occurring  
10 within the limits of any park in the city.

13 Sec. 30-20. - Notice by signs.

14 The mayor is authorized, or his or her designee, to give notice  
15 of the provisions of sections 30-18 and 30-19 by means of  
16 appropriate public signs in, at and upon city parks, park  
17 facilities and park premises.

19 Sec. 30-21. - Penalty.

20 Any person convicted of any violation of the provisions of this  
21 article shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and punished as provided  
22 in section 1-10.

23 (Code 1969, § 30-17.4)

1 Sec. 30-22. - Tampering with park property; posting,  
2 distributing advertising.

3 It shall be unlawful for any person to cut, mar, deface, mark,  
4 injure, break, destroy or interfere with any of the buildings,  
5 benches, chairs, seats, fences, booths, fixtures, lamps, globes,  
6 lighting or apparatus or fixtures, railings, sidewalks, bridges,  
7 fountains, trees, shrubbery, plants, cages, enclosures, or any of  
8 the property placed, used or kept in or about city parks, squares  
9 or grounds or to tear, pull up, cut, break or remove, injure or  
10 destroy any trees, plants, flowers, grass or other vegetation or  
11 any part thereof; nor shall any bills, advertisements, placards or  
12 signs be distributed or placed in or on any of the parks, squares  
13 or grounds. This section shall not be construed to prevent the  
14 superintendent of parks from placing and maintaining signs  
15 connected with the maintenance and administration of the parks,  
16 grounds or squares, or to do all things necessary to improve and  
17 maintain such parks.

19 Sec. 30-23. - Interfering with animals, water bodies.

20 No person shall annoy, interfere with, kill, maim, tantalize,  
21 or in any way injure any beasts, birds, fishes (except as provided  
22 in 30-23.5 (c)), game or animals of every kind in any way in any  
23 city park, square or grounds or connected therewith or belonging  
24 thereto. No person shall chase, hunt or frighten any such animal

1 or permit or aid the escape thereof or scare away or drive away  
2 any such animal, or throw stones, clubs, sticks or other missiles  
3 therein or at any such animals. No person shall obstruct, interfere  
4 with, pollute or divert the water in a city park, square or  
5 grounds, or break or injure the ice formed thereon.

7 Sec. 30-23.5. - Hunting, firearms and explosives prohibited.

8 (a) No person shall hunt game animals on city park  
9 property, unless otherwise exempted in subsection (c), nor  
10 carry, possess, transport or discharge on or across city  
11 park property, any firearm, B.B. or pellet or air powered  
12 gun, sling shot, stun gun, home-made cannon or any object  
13 of an explosive nature, including but not limited to  
14 fireworks or other objects or devices, nor any item  
15 manufactured or designed to discharge or propel an object  
16 in a manner similar to a firearm or other barreled  
17 instrument.

18 (b) No person shall possess, have or carry any bow and  
19 arrow, switchblade, hunting knife, dagger, metal knuckles,  
20 bludgeon, karate sticks, slingshot or other dangerous  
21 weapon while on city park property.

22 (c) Except as provided herein, no person shall fish while  
23 on city park property. A person may fish from the shore or



1 from a pier at Mastodon Lake in Phillips Park, in the  
2 posted areas. Ice fishing is not allowed at any time.

3 (d) Exemptions. Any person or group that has received  
4 written notification or a permit to conduct an activity in  
5 subsection (a), (b) or (c) by the superintendent of parks.

6 Sec. 30-24. - Digging into, damaging ground surface.

7 It shall be unlawful for any person to dig into, open, tear up  
8 or injure any ground, pavement, crosswalk, grass plat or roadway  
9 or any part thereof in a park, square or public grounds, except  
10 with the permission of the superintendent of parks.

11 (Code 1969, § 30-20)

12 Sec. 30-25. - Damaging, interfering with utilities.

13 It shall be unlawful for any person to tear up, injure, destroy,  
14 disconnect or interfere with any water pipes, sewers, wiring or  
15 conduits in any city park, square or public grounds, except with  
16 the permission of the superintendent of parks.

17 (Code 1969, § 30-21)

18 Sec. 30-26. - Moving buildings.

19 It shall be unlawful for any person to move any buildings upon  
20 or over any city park, square or public grounds.

21 (Code 1969, § 30-22)

22 Sec. 30-27. - Alcoholic liquor policy.

23 (a) Except as otherwise provided in this section, it shall  
24 be unlawful for any person or organization to sell or give

1 away, consume or possess, any alcoholic liquor in any city  
2 park, square or public grounds.

3 (b) Beer and wine may be sold and/or served for consumption  
4 on park premises and/or facilities at city sponsored or city  
5 co-sponsored special events. Any such approved organization  
6 must obtain any and all applicable state and local permits as  
7 required under the Illinois Liquor Control Act, 235 ILCS 5/1-  
8 1, et seq. and chapter 6 of the City of Aurora Code of  
9 Ordinances, as well as dram shop and/or liability insurance. A  
10 copy of the insurance policy showing the City of Aurora as an  
11 added insured shall be provided to the local liquor commissioner  
12 and the parks superintendent.

13 For purposes of this section only, the following terms shall be  
14 construed according to the definitions given below:

15 *City sponsored event* shall mean any event that is directly  
16 operated or sponsored by the city and for which the city may  
17 provide financial support or any other type of city support.

18 *City co-sponsored event* shall mean events sponsored by the city  
19 with an organization, when it is determined that the event is of  
20 general interest to the public and advances the promotion of the  
21 community. For this type of event, the city may provide financial  
22 support or any other type of city support as agreed upon with the  
23 co-sponsoring organization(s).

1       *Special events* shall mean any transient amusement enterprise,  
2 outdoor temporary gathering (four (4) days or less), and any  
3 similar event organized directly by the city or in conjunction  
4 with an approved organization, including, but not limited to  
5 parades, arts and crafts shows, festivals/fairs, sporting  
6 events/tournaments, musical performances, public shows, or other  
7 such similar events.

8       (c) No person shall enter or remain on city park property in  
9       an intoxicated condition.

11       Sec. 30-28. - Trash and encumbrances.

12       It shall be unlawful for any person to place, throw, deposit or  
13 cause to be thrown, placed or deposited any straw, chips, shells,  
14 ashes, swill, rubbish, refuse, dirt, stones or encumbrances of any  
15 kind upon any city park, square or public grounds.

16       (Code 1969, § 30-24)

17       Sec. 30-29. - Animals at large.

18       It shall be unlawful for any person to cause, suffer or permit  
19 horses, cattle, swine, sheep, dogs or other animals to run loose  
20 on any city park, square or public grounds. This prohibition shall  
21 not apply to supervised domesticated dogs in designated city dog  
22 parks.

23       (Code 1969, § 30-25)

24       Sec. 30-30. - Animals restricted to roadways.

1 It shall be unlawful for any person to lead, drive or ride any  
2 horses, cattle or other animals, including animals in a petting  
3 zoo, upon the grass plats or in any city park, square or public  
4 grounds.

5 (Code 1969, § 30-26)

6 Sec. 30-31. - Racing prohibited; speed limit.

7 It is unlawful for any person to race horses, bicycles or  
8 vehicles in a city park, square or public place. No person shall  
9 operate a vehicle or drive an animal in a city park, square or  
10 public place in excess of the speed limit for same. Unless posted  
11 otherwise, the speed limit in all city parks, squares and public  
12 places is fifteen (15) miles per hour.

14 Sec. 30-32. - Obstructing drives or paths.

15 It shall be unlawful for any person to block, obstruct or  
16 encumber the drives or paths of a city park, square or public  
17 place.

18 (Code 1969, § 30-28)

19 Sec. 30-33. - Keeping off the grass.

20 It shall be unlawful for any person to go upon the grass, lawn  
21 or turf of city park premises wherever signs and directions are  
22 placed to keep off the grass.

23 (Code 1969, § 30-29)

24 Sec. 30-34. - Animal Excrement. ~~Vehicles for hire, trucks.~~

1 (a) It is unlawful for any owner or person having control of  
2 any animal to knowingly cause or permit such animal to be on  
3 any lands; or properties owned by the city including without  
4 limitation any street, sidewalk, parkway, park, conveyance or  
5 other public place or facility, unless such person has in his  
6 or her immediate possession a device for the removal, and a  
7 depository for the transportation, of animal excrement from  
8 such property.

9 (b) It is unlawful for any person having custody or control of  
10 any animal while causing or permitting such animal to be on  
11 any lands or properties owned by the city to knowingly fail to  
12 remove from such property excrement left by such animal.

13 ~~It shall be unlawful for any person to solicit patronage for~~  
14 ~~any vehicle for hire in any parks or drive or take any job, freight~~  
15 ~~or truck vehicle, or any vehicle of the second division as defined~~  
16 ~~in section 1-217 of The Illinois Vehicle Code [Ill. Rev. Stat. Ch.~~  
17 ~~95½, ¶ 1-217], except such as are used in carrying on the work of~~  
18 ~~the park.~~

20 Sec. 30-35. - Fires; games or amusements obstructing passage.

21 It shall be unlawful for any person to light, make or use any  
22 fire on city park grounds, or to engage in any amusement or game  
23 that will obstruct or tend to interfere with the passage of persons

1 or vehicles, or to hit golf balls in any park except in designated  
2 areas.

4 Sec. 30-36. Reserved. - ~~Unlawful assemblies, riots.~~

5 ~~It shall be unlawful for any person to take part in or cause to~~  
6 ~~be assembled crowds for unlawful purposes or in any riots or~~  
7 ~~unlawful assemblies in any city park.~~

8 ~~(Code 1969, § 30-34)~~

9 Sec. 30-37. - Use of walks, paths, drives.

10 It shall be unlawful for any person to enter or leave a city  
11 park or park premises except by the walks, paths or drives.

12 (Code 1969, § 30-35)

13 Sec. 30-38. - Special activities and events on city park  
14 property.

15 ~~On any holiday and on occasions of gatherings of people in the~~  
16 ~~city parks and places, the superintendent of parks may authorize~~  
17 ~~in writing the selling or giving away of fruits, candies,~~  
18 ~~refreshments, soft drinks, popcorn, nuts and other eatables; and~~  
19 ~~the holding of parades, drills and other military evolutions, games~~  
20 ~~and contests and other amusements that would contribute to the~~  
21 ~~lawful enjoyment of the public. The superintendent of parks may~~  
22 ~~permit the cutting of flowers and placing the same on the graves~~  
23 ~~of soldiers and sailors in the cemeteries of the city for use on~~  
24 ~~May 30 of each year. Where it will not interfere with or defeat~~

1 ~~the purposes for which the parks and premises are maintained, the~~  
2 ~~superintendent may allow funeral processions and vehicles carrying~~  
3 ~~the human dead to pass upon and along the streets and highways~~  
4 ~~through such premises. Nothing in this chapter shall be construed~~  
5 ~~to authorize or permit the superintendent to discriminate between~~  
6 ~~persons in like situations, nor shall the same be construed to~~  
7 ~~invalidate, hold in abeyance or inhibit the operation of the~~  
8 ~~ordinances of the city over such premises.~~

9 (a) On any holiday and on occasions of gatherings of  
10 people in the city parks and places, the superintendent of  
11 parks may authorize, through a permit, vendors to sell  
12 food, holding of parades, drills and other military  
13 evolutions, weddings (limited to certain parks as  
14 determined by Resolution from time-to-time), and amusements  
15 that would contribute to the lawful enjoyment of the  
16 public.

17 (b) Special events may be held at city parks with a  
18 permit. An application for a permit must be completed and  
19 turned in to the Parks Maintenance subdivision. Once a  
20 completed application is received, the superintendent of  
21 parks will review the application and based upon  
22 availability of the park, reviewing any past incidents that  
23 have occurred in the park or on other city property, and

1 receiving the security deposit and any other required  
2 forms, issue a permit to allow a special event.

3 (c) Any denial of an application for a special event at a  
4 city park shall be appealed pursuant to the administrative  
5 hearing procedure established in Chapter 12, Article VII of  
6 this Code.

7 (d) Deposit and fees for special activities and special  
8 events at city parks shall be set from time-to-time by  
9 Resolution.

13 This Article shall be updated or amended from time-to-time by

16 ~~Sec. 30-71. - Charges established.~~

17 ~~(a) The charges which shall be made for use of the municipal~~  
18 ~~swimming pools shall be as established by ordinance or~~  
19 ~~resolution. Such charges shall consist of fees for residents,~~  
20 ~~nonresidents, special group rate charges and other charges.~~

21 ~~(b) Participants in qualified summer recreation programs shall be~~  
22 ~~charged the resident swimming rate for supervised group~~  
23 ~~swimming activities during regular pool hours. A qualified~~  
24 ~~summer recreation program is one that is conducted on a regular~~



1 ~~schedule by a not for profit organization located within the~~  
2 ~~city. Such groups must provide adequate adult supervision~~  
3 ~~during the swimming activities. Residents of park districts who~~  
4 ~~have contracted with the city for pool admission shall also be~~  
5 ~~charged the resident swimming rate. Organizations or park~~  
6 ~~districts wishing to qualify for the resident swimming rate~~  
7 ~~shall make application to the mayor.~~

9 ~~Sec. 30-72. - Collection, disposition of charges.~~

10 ~~The appointed managers of each municipal swimming pool shall~~  
11 ~~collect charges and make daily deposits and reports under the~~  
12 ~~direction of the city treasurer. The police department of the city~~  
13 ~~shall assist the city treasurer in the collection of fees~~  
14 ~~collected.~~

15 ~~(Code 1969, § 30-48)~~

16 ~~Sec. 30-73. - Hours of operation; opening and closing dates.~~

17 ~~The municipal swimming pools shall be open on each day of~~  
18 ~~operation from 12:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m., depending upon weather~~  
19 ~~conditions, and as such other times as determined in the discretion~~  
20 ~~of the superintendent of parks. The swimming pools shall be opened~~  
21 ~~on or about June 7 of each year and closed on or about the last~~  
22 ~~Sunday in August of each year, depending upon weather conditions.~~

24 ~~Sec. 30-74. - Compliance with health laws.~~

1       ~~The municipal swimming pools shall be operated and maintained~~  
2 ~~in accordance with the public health laws of the state and in~~

4 ~~superintendent may close the pools when in his professional~~  
5 ~~judgment he believes it to be in the interest of public health~~  
6 ~~that the pools be closed, and the same shall be reopened only upon~~

10       ~~The manager of each municipal swimming pool shall be authorized~~  
11 ~~and empowered to expel any person from using the swimming pools~~

13 ~~superintendent of parks shall in his discretion deny the use of~~  
14 ~~the swimming pools to any person for repeated infraction of the~~  
15 ~~rules, regulations, improper or immoral conduct, or violation of~~  
16 ~~this article, and may cancel the registration card issued to such~~  
17 ~~person.~~

20       ~~Rules and regulations governing the use and conduct of users of~~

23 ~~posted at each pool in a conspicuous place.~~

15 ARTICLE IV. - PHILLIPS PARK MUNICIPAL GOLF COURSE ~~AND AURORA FOX~~  
16 ~~VALLEY GOLF COURSE~~

17 Sec. 30-96. - Fees.

18 The golf fees for playing on the municipal courses at Phillips  
19 Park and ~~Fox Valley Golf Course~~, payable in advance of commencing  
20 play, shall be determined from time to time by ordinance or  
21 resolution of the city council, in the following categories:

22 (1) ~~Registration~~ Annual Membership card. An ~~Aurora~~  
23 ~~registration~~ Annual Membership card is available for a  
24 nominal fee to any resident or non-resident of the city.

1 This ~~registration~~ card permits playing as a registered  
2 player in accordance with annual green fees established by  
3 city council. ~~City residents~~ Golfers must have a  
4 ~~registration card~~ an Annual Membership in their possession  
5 or they will be charged ~~nonresident~~ public rates. These cards  
6 are a ~~photo~~ laminate.

7 (2) ~~Season tickets~~ Passes.

8 a. Aurora resident senior citizens (~~sixty-five~~ (65<sup>0</sup>) years
