## A RESOLUTION SETTING CERTAIN MOTOR VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC FEES AND FINES IN THE CITY OF AURORA

WHEREAS, the City of Aurora has a population of more than 25,000 persons and is, therefore, a home rule unit under subsection (a) of Section 6 of Article VII of the Illinois Constitution of 1970; and

WHEREAS, subject to said Section, a home rule unit may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs for the protection of the public health, safety, morals and welfare; and

WHEREAS, in furtherance of it's home rule powers, it is necessary and desirable for the City of Aurora to assess motor vehicles and traffic fees and fines; and

WHEREAS, it is further desirable to provide for ease in locating all related fees in one document, therefore, this Resolution supersedes all prior Resolutions as to these fees.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the City Council of the City of Aurora, Illinois, that the fees and fines motor vehicles and traffic related fees as set forth in Exhibit "A"; attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as if fully set forth, shall be in effect upon adoption hereof.

A Resolution Setting Certain Motor Vehicles and Traffic Fees and Fines

This past month when the Downtown Parking Management Report with Recommendations was presented to Committee, discussion not only ensued on the merits of the parking recommendations, but also the best way to incorporate those changes in Chapter 27 of the municipal Code. As part of the revisions to Chapter 27 it is recommended that ALL motor vehicle-related fees, fines and penalties be consolidated in one document. Attached is a comparison of the proposed Motor Vehicle Fees and Fines compared with the current fees, fines and penalties. To Summarize:

- The recommendation is to remove all meters, both on- and off-street. It is recommended to roll this out in a systematic manner with a completion estimated by mid- 2013. The revisions to Chapter 27 and the Motor Vehicle Fees and Fines will allow us to do accomplish this while still being able to have an efficient and effective parking program. As of the effective date there will no longer be a charge assessed for parking at a meter.
- 2. It is recommended that parking permits be categorized. Theses permits would be tied to parking demand with the permits in the highest demand areas being the most expensive and the permits in the lowest demand areas being less expensive. There is also a new overnight permit for the Central Business District.
- Freight, Passenger, and Valet Loading. Chapter 27 amends the Loading and Unloading Section of the Code. There are revised fees associated with these zones to reflect the changes to Chapter 27. The Standard Freight Loading Zone will remain free however additional loading zone types will be allowed at a fee. The procedures and conditions for these zones are outlined in Chapter 27.
