# SUBJECT:

A Resolution Authorizing Well Maintenance Services for Well No. 26 for the Water Production Division in an amount not to exceed \$180,000.

# PURPOSE:

To obtain City Council authorization for Layne Christensen Company (Layne), 721 W. Illinois Avenue, Aurora, IL, to perform all necessary services as described in Layne's proposal letter (attached) to return Well No. 26 to full operational and functional status.

## BACKGROUND:

Well No. 26, located at 2026 Nottingham Drive, is a deep well with the pump and motor setting at 775 feet below the surface and is normally capable of supplying approximately 800,000 gallons of water per day. The well's pumping equipment experienced a failure on March 16, 2021. Preliminary testing from the surface by both Water Production Division (WPD) staff and Layne indicated an apparent electrical problem with the Flowserve-Byron Jackson 2400-volt, 250 horsepower, submersible well pump motor. In order to determine the exact cause of the motor failure the well pump/motor assembly must be removed from the well for inspection and further testing. Under a not-to-exceed purchase order of \$25,000.00, Layne has completed the removal of the pumping equipment and confirmed that an electrical grounding occurred within the motor making it inoperable. The normal time for a complete electrical repair of this type of motor can be up to twelve weeks. Thus, the WPD will work with Layne to have Well No. 26 operational as soon as possible as we head into the high water demand summer season.

## DISCUSSION:

The total estimated cost of all proposed and recently completed work by Layne to restore Well No. 26 to operational status is \$176,405. A detailed breakdown of the estimated costs is presented in Layne's proposal letter.

The city entered into a Professional Services Agreement (PSA) with Layne in 2020 under Resolution No. R20-083, which provides a 5% discount on all labor and field services and a 10% discount on specialized services performed by Layne. Layne will perform all work on a time and material basis and will only be compensated for the actual work performed per the terms and conditions of the PSA. In addition, Layne is the sole regional factory authorized source for repair services of Flowserve-Byron Jackson pumps and motors utilized by the Water Production Division.

A budget transfer has been submitted to Account No. 510-4058-511-38-31 for the 2021 budget.

### **IMPACT STATEMENT:**

Unavailability of approximately 800,000 gallons/day of raw source groundwater if the repairs are not completed.

#### **RECOMMENDATIONS:**

That a resolution authorizing well maintenance services for Well No. 26 by Layne Christensen Company per the existing PSA in an amount not to exceed \$180,000.00 be approved by the Mayor and City Council. It is further recommended that this matter be submitted to the Finance Committee for review and recommendation.

#### DATE OF PASSAGE

A Resolution Authorizing Well Maintenance Services for Well No. 26 for the Water Production Division in an amount not to exceed \$180,000.00 to Layne Christensen Company, Aurora, IL. WHEREAS, the City of Aurora has a population of more than 25,000 persons and is, therefore, a home rule unit under subsection (a) of Section 6 of Article VII of the Illinois Constitution of 1970; and

WHEREAS, subject to said Section, a home rule unit may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs for the protection of the public health, safety, morals, and welfare; and

WHEREAS, Well No. 26 requires equipment repairs and/or replacement in order to return the well to normal operational status; and

WHEREAS, Layne Christensen Company, Aurora, IL, is the sole local factory authorized representative for service and repairs to Flowserve-Byron Jackson well pump equipment utilized by the Water Production Division; and

WHEREAS, a current Professional Services Agreement is in effect between the City of Aurora and Layne Christensen Company for professional services to include but not limited to water well maintenance, well equipment repair, and field services as per City of Aurora Resolution No. R20-083; and

WHEREAS, a budget transfer has been submitted to Account No. 510-4058-511-38-31.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Aurora, Illinois, as follows: that its Purchasing Director be and is hereby authorized to issue a purchase order for well maintenance for Well No. 26 by Layne Christensen Company, in a total amount not to exceed \$180,000.00 for the Water Production Division.
